A: The key to building a reliable anti-cheat system for a video game is to always assume that it's the user's fault. If the player is cheating, then they have a goal, and it's possible to track their progress toward that goal. If the game is cheating, then the player has no goal, and so no clues as to how to track their progress. Cheaters will perform actions that are different from the normal use of the game. For example, if you're playing an action game, they might use a controller that lets them walk faster. When the game isn't cheating, they use a controller that allows them to walk at the same speed as everyone else in the game. If the cheating model and the non-cheating model are completely identical, then you have no problem - the game is transparent and anything the player can do in one mode will be doable in the other. If the cheating model isn't identical, though, you'll have to add an anti-cheat step. If the cheating and non-cheating modes share the same basic model of the game, then I would recommend building a new model of the game, and replacing the original game with it. If the cheating and non-cheating models don't share the same basic model of the game, then I would recommend doing something similar to what the Garry's Mod team has done for Garry's Mod, which is to simply make a user who has disabled the anti-cheat system unable to use the game. If you add this new user to the current user database, then when the new user starts the game, they're "injected" with the new user database.
